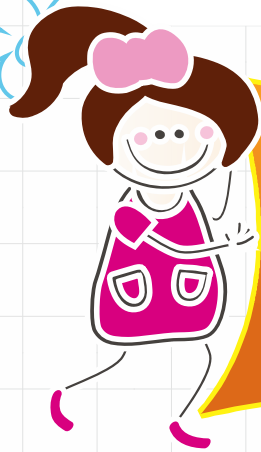


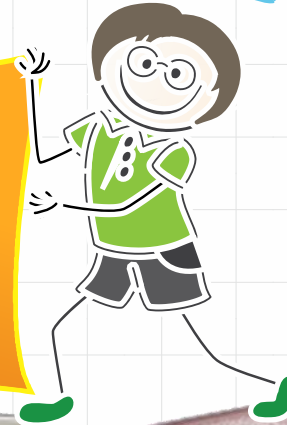

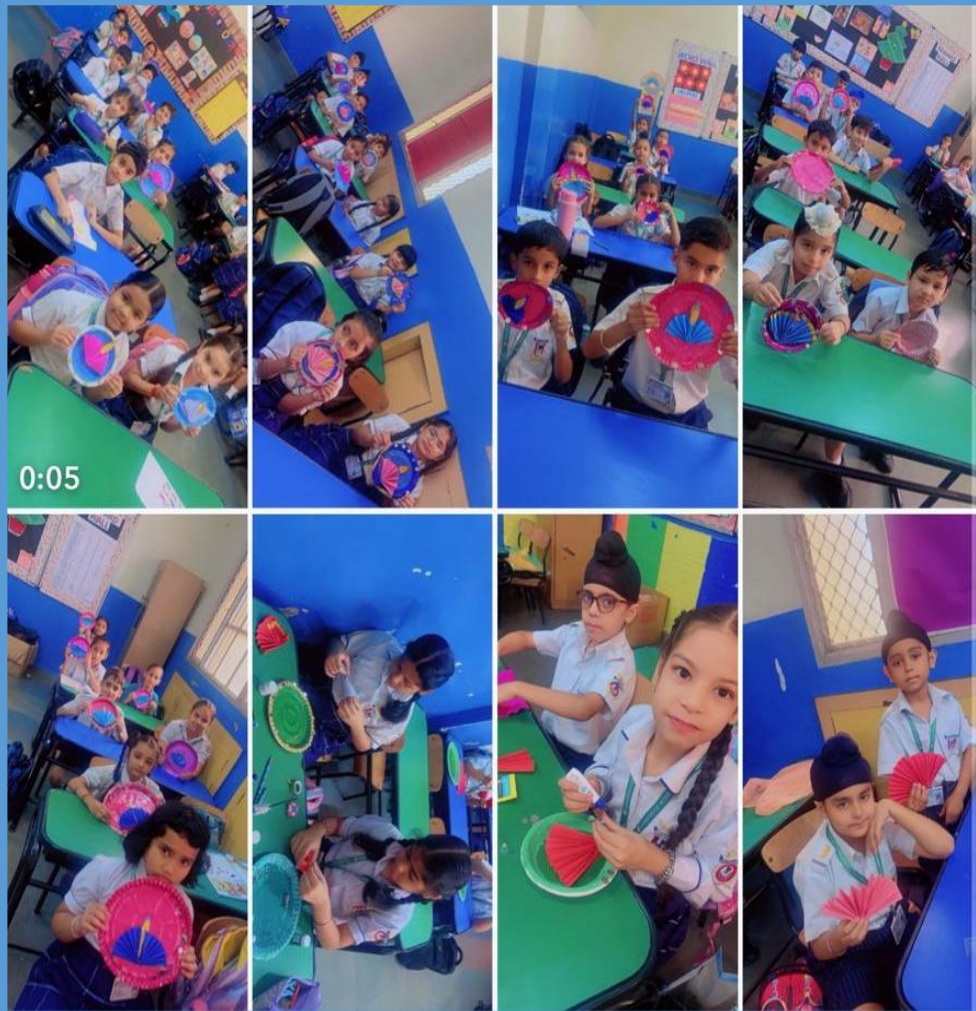
ART WEEK

LPU TECHSPRINT



November 7,8 , 2025



The school celebrates outstanding achievements of its students at the prestigious LPU TechSprint 2025, where innovation and ingenuity took center stage. Demonstrating exceptional technical acumen and creativity, Nayasha (Grade 12) and Tania Puri (Grade 11) clinched the First Prize in the Rope Rangers Competition by designing a working robot capable of crawling on a rope—an impressive feat of mechanical engineering. In the InnoTank category, Anant Jhamb (9A), Maanit Arora, and Manvir Singh(8C) secured the First Runner-up position with their AI-trained model designed to detect and collect space debris using a 3D-printed gripping mechanism, showcasing their futuristic vision and application of machine learning. The Second Runner-up position in the same category was awarded to Simar Kaur Hundal, Harneet Kaur Lally, Jasnoor Kaur Jagpal, and Navdeep Kaur Dubb(9D), who developed a school safety model integrating multiple sensors and controllers, reflecting their commitment to real-world problem-solving. Adding to the accolades, Jasmeen Thabal (8A) and Prabhdeep Kaur (8D) received the Best Commercialization Award in the Idea Ignite category for their innovative concept “Flavour Loop,” which aims to reduce fruit wastage in cold storage by converting pulp into essence—a sustainable and market-ready idea.
